Boston MedFlight is a CAMTS accredited Critical Care Transport service. BMF's mission is to extend the tertiary care services of the major Boston teaching hospitals to the citizens of Massachusetts and New England. The service is available 24 hours a day and seven days a week.

As a not-for-profit organization, BMF transports patients regardless of their ability to pay. Boston MedFlight is supported by a consortium of Boston hospitals including Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, Brigham and Women's Hospital, Children's Hospital, Massachusetts General Hospital, and Tufts Medical Center. Since 1985, Boston MedFlight has played an integral role as part of the Massachusetts EMS system and the community hospitals of New England.

Directions From Rte. 95/128:

Take EXIT 30B (Rte. 2A West). Follow Rte. 2A West for 2 miles, then follow signs for Hanscom Air Force Base. Turn right onto Hanscom Drive and proceed to the visitor's center. Stop at the guard shack for a mandatory driver's license ID check by base security. Be sure to have your car registration with you. Allow extra time for check-in. Motorcycles are prohibited by base security.

is a standardized, two day course providing basic critical care information to the non-critical care specialist. FCCS was designed by a national

committee of leading multi-specialty critical care physician educators in anesthesiology, emergency medicine, family practice, internal medicine, nursing, pediatrics and surgery.

This FCCS provider course offers an approach to initial management of the critically ill patient for providers not formally trained in critical care. It offers useful information about extended care of the critically ill patients, especially care related to mechanical ventilation, monitoring, organ hypo-perfusion, and neurological support. The course offers guidance for acute problems encountered in the ICU as well as guidance for sudden patient deterioration.

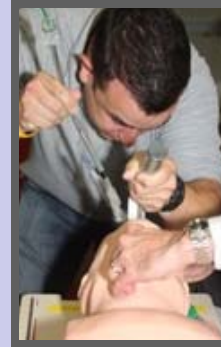
